

Environmental policy

B.F.T. has its own responsibilities concerning the environment. With these responsibilities in mind, B.F.T. has drawn up an environmental policy which is designed to manage, control and where possible reduce the impact of the activities of B.F.T. on the environment. The environmental policy is an integral part of the day-to-day management of the organisation.

The B.F.T. environmental policy is based on a number of points:

1. **Legal requirements**
The legal requirements shall be met at all times. Additional measures will be taken where B.F.T. considers this to be necessary.
2. **Environmental awareness of personnel**
The environmental awareness of the personnel shall be encouraged. Care of the environment is an integral part of the employee's tasks and the employee has his own responsibility for the environment.
3. **Sub contractors**
Sub contractors are expected to work according to current environmental regulations, and they are expected to fulfil their own obligations to the environment.
4. **Essential equipment**
B.F.T. will provide the equipment essential to carrying out the stated environmental policy, as far as this lies within the capacity of B.F.T.
5. **Incidents**
In order to minimise the impact on the environment in the event of an incident, the procedures set out in the contingency plan should always be followed. An investigation into the causes of an incident will always take place where environmental pollution may be involved. Measures will then be taken to prevent the repetition of such an incident.
6. **New business activities**
When new business activities are initiated, consideration of the possible consequences for the environment will be an integral part of the decision process.
7. **Consultation**
Consultation concerning environmental issues within the umbrella organisation and with clients is considered to be of utmost importance. Good communication with regional and national government is also considered to be important.
